Guillaume Rouchon is pleased to announce the first solo exhibition in Israel of German artist Susanne M. Winterling (b. 1970, based in Berlin and Oslo).

At once in the continuum of her formal and conceptual language and building from impressions subsequent to her recent first visit to Israel, Winterling will present a new body of work created for the space and consisting of photographic prints and a 16 mm film. Additionally she has invited French artist Nadira Husain (b. 1980, based in Berlin and Paris) to collaborate with her on a large-scale sculpture that will connect the ceiling of the gallery to its floor.

Concerned with representations of realities rather than moments, and placing an utmost emphasis on the constraints imposed by the materiality of the chosen medium, Winterling stages encounters between actual objects and their two-dimensional counterparts. In doing so, she suggests tenuous relationships between a tightly selected array of cultural generalities and their relevance in terms of personal and collective value. In this exhibition, *Nox and Shelter*, these cultural references include politician and philosopher Simone Weil, novelist and playwright Jean Genet, filmmaker Rainer Werner Fassbinder, or writer Anne Carson.
